Sonlight is...a not-for-profit, in our 36th year of operation. We present the gospel through programs and relationships. We focus on community and teamwork, striving to accept diversity, and appreciate each individual as a child of God. We are governed by a Board of Directors. Our mission is to minister to young people in a camping environment based on Christian community.

About Sonlight

Founded in 1979 by Winston and Mary Marugg, Sonlight is a non-denominational Christian youth camp. We focus summer on our resident youth camps and high adventure programs for kids 3rd grade through high school.

Fall, Winter and Spring Sonlight is available for church or non-profit groups to rent the facility and run their own program for a week or weekend. Sonlight provides facilities and food service.

Finance: Sonlight operates with a balanced budget. We offer subsidized tier tuition for our summer camps, acknowledging that families have different financial situations. Sonlight also offers additional scholarships to families in need.

Accreditations

Sonlight is licensed as a residential youth camp in Colorado. All summer programs have been reviewed by the American Camp Association (ACA) and are fully accredited.



A Typical Week of Summer Camp

Most camps start Sunday afternoon between 4:30-5:30. Campers have time to move in to their cabins, meet their counselors and cabin mates, enjoy a warm cookie in the dining room and check in with healthcare staff.

A typical day starts with breakfast, then worship, a talk from our speaker, small group and quiet time. The rest of the morning and then afternoon allows time for group activities, or “options”, where campers can choose how to spend their time. Crafts, archery, a soccer game, dodgeball, mountain bikes, “Diggler” (mountain scooters), building a fort in the woods, or the climbing wall may be included in the choices. Group games fill the evening- dodgeball or capture the flag, with plenty of time for a campfire program each night.

Meals are served family style, all meals are home cooked. Vegetarian and gluten free options are offered at every meal. (*Please note Sonlight does not have a gluten free kitchen, so there is the possibility of cross contamination. For several allergies please consult with the food service supervisor for details.) Snacks are available throughout the day. A water bottle is provided for each camper, no soda machine is available.

Dependent on the river flow, all campers will go rafting on the Animas River in Durango. Sonlight contracts with a professional rafting company in Durango.

A day hike is part of each week, with the middle school and high school kids having the opportunity to hike in the South San Juan or Weminuche Wilderness, usually with the opportunity to climb a nearby peak.

Preparation For Camp

At the time of registration, each camper will receive confirmation details, to include a ‘What to Bring’ list, health form, and physical form (required every other year). Payment in full, as well as the health and physical forms are due in the Sonlight office by May 15th.

Mail and Packages

Sonlight has a daily mail call for campers. You may bring pre-written letters, postcards or small packages to camp on opening day, no postage required. They’ll be included in mail call on the day you indicate on the letter or package. You also may send mail thru USPS. Address the mail to:

Campers have time each day for some bunk time, and counselors will encourage campers to write home. Pre-stamped, pre-addressed envelopes are suggested.

Free One-way E-mail

Sonlight provided a free, one-way e-mail system for all camp families. E-mails are printed and given to campers during daily mail call. *Please note* campers cannot send return e-mails. You may access the email service at sonlightcamp.org.

Phones and Phone Calls: Unplugged!

Parents are encouraged to be upbeat and positive about the upcoming camp experience, especially for younger kids. Campers are not allowed to call home. Parents are welcome to call the Sonlight office if they have specific concerns about their child. All campers will be expected to turn in any cell phones at the beginning of camp. Campers will not be allowed to keep any device which is a phone, or has capability to connect to the internet.

Cabin Buddy Requests

Sonlight welcomes cabin buddy requests, and we do our best to put friends together. For first time campers we dutifully honor buddy requests. We do value a healthy, whole community, however, and in most circumstances will not put large groups of campers together in the same cabin.

Bedding

Camper bring their own sleeping bag or sheets and blankets. Pillows are provided, though many kids prefer their own pillow. Campers provide their own towels.

Spending Money

Sonlight has a small store with t-shirts, sweatshirts, postcards and small items. All proceeds benefit the Sonlight Scholarship Fund. The store is open on arrival and departure day. Campers do not need spending money during their week at camp.

Finishing Camp

Closing Parent Program

All resident camps close with a short program on departure day. Sessions ending in the morning include homemade cinnamon rolls for parents. A video of the week will be shown and short wrap up of our week. All campers will receive a group photo from the week.

Lost And Found

All lost and found will be kept at Sonlight for 2 weeks. After that time it is donated to a local thrift store. We will do all we can to return items to the proper camper, please be sure clothing is well marked.

Online Parent Evaluation

Sonlight values parent feedback so we can stay relevant. After camp, parents will receive a link to an online evaluation form, and we take the feedback seriously.

Money Matters

A \$100 deposit is required to register for camp (unless other arrangement is made with the director). Payment is due in full by May 15th. Payment plans are available, the Sonlight registrar will automatically charge your card once a month in the amount you request. Payments may be made online, or you may send a check to camp for payment. A \$50 non-refundable fee is charged for cancellations. No-shows or early departures are non-refundable.

Scholarships

Sonlight offers a Tiered Pricing system, you may choose a subsidized tuition at the time of registration if you need financial assistance to attend camp. Additional scholarships in the amount of \$195 are available should you need even more financial aid. Contact Winston Marugg, Director for scholarship funds. Camp Policies

Attendance

It is expected that campers remain in the camp program for the duration of their camp. Parents may take campers in specific circumstances if the camp is notified in advance. Campers who drive themselves will turn in their vehicle keys at the beginning of the session.

Behavior

Sonlight strives to be an environment free from discrimination, violence, intimidation and harassment based on gender, race, creed, color, national origin, sexual orientation or disability. Language, behavior and attitudes that intimidate, offend or debilitate campers or staff members are not tolerated.

Sonlight does not tolerate emotional or physical abuse or the threat of such abuse of one person by another. It may be grounds for dismissal from the program. If necessary, you will be notified and your child will be sent home at your expense without refund.

Entrance Screening and Contraband

Upon moving in to their cabin, campers will have their belongings screened by the counselor. Contraband includes:

- Cell phones
- Any device with the capability to connect to the internet
- Food, including candy and gum
- Illegal substances, alcohol and tobacco
- Weapons, lighters
- Offensive clothing
- Music not appropriate for a Christian youth camp

Photos and Video of Campers and Staff

Written permission to take camper and staff photos is included on the health form. Photos will be posted on the camp website during the week of camp. No guarantee is made for a photo of each child. Photo pages are password protected during the session when campers are at camp. Names or any identifying information is not posted on the website. Each camper will be provided with a group photo at the end of the week. All photos are the property of Sonlight Camp, and may be used on the website or in printed material for promotion. No compensation will be made to staff or campers whose photo is used. The video download of the week and a photo download will be available for purchase at the end of the camp session. All proceeds go directly to the Sonlight scholarship fund.

Respect For Personal and Camp Property

All campers and staff are expected to respect camp property, and the belongings and property of other campers and staff. Destruction or intentional abuse of property may be grounds for immediate dismissal. Campers may bring personal sports equipment to camp with permission from the Program Director, but all sports equipment must be used within the guidelines for camp sports equipment, and only at times approved by the Program Director.

Weapons Policy

The use, possession, or carrying of any kind of firearm or weapon on the property of Sonlight Christian Camp is strictly prohibited. Sonlight retains final authority in determining what constitutes a weapon, especially when evaluating potential danger.

Specifically prohibited items include, but are not limited to, knife blades, lasers, numchucks, shockers, razor blades, brass knuckles, acid, metal pipes, stun guns, BB guns, firearms, pistols, shotguns, rifles, ammunition, explosive devices, fireworks, pyrotechnics, any other instruments capable of inflicting serious injury and/or other common materials used for the purpose of inflicting fear or injury.

Healthcare at Sonlight

Healthcare Staff

Sonlight provides healthcare staff for all programs, not all healthcare staff are RN's or PA's, though an RN or PA is usually on site. Healthcare is supervised by Mary Marugg, RN.

Healthcare Facilities

In addition to a small, simple healthcare facility at Sonlight, Sonlight has access to a clinic, hospital and pharmacy in Pagosa Springs. These supporting health services, including an EMS service, are 30 minutes from Sonlight.

Scope of Service

Healthcare at Sonlight is limited care of routine illness and injury, we do not have physicians in residence. We do have medical protocols signed by our supervising physician, and we stock selected over the counter medications.

Medications at Camp

If your child takes medications on a routine basis, we will administer these during their session at Sonlight. By Colorado regulation the medications must be provided to Sonlight in the original pharmacy container, and be prescribed to the person we will be administering them to. Colorado state regulation prohibits campers from keeping their own medications, with the exception of epi-pens and rescue inhalers. Medications will be collected on opening day, when your camper checks in with healthcare staff.

Communicable Disease

Sonlight reserves the right to not enroll a camper who is ill at the time of camp opening, or has been exposed to communicable disease. Campers may have a delayed arrival of a day or two if they are ill.

Health Forms and Physical Forms

Colorado State regulation requires a current health form on file for each camper and staff member, a new health form every year. A Physical Form, with a physician, nurse practitioner or physician assistant exam is required within 12 months of the camp session. Sonlight does keep forms on file, so your child will need to provide an updated Physical Form the first year of camp attendance, and every other year after that. Health forms are due in the Sonlight office by May 15th.

Health Information

Sonlight healthcare staff have access to all health forms. Beyond that, health information is shared with Sonlight staff only on a "need to know" basis.

Parent Communication Regarding Health Concerns at Camp

Sonlight healthcare or administrative staff will communicate with parents or guardians any time there is a need for out of camp healthcare. We will contact parents /guardians with any concerns we have regarding your child.

We do not routinely contact parents for healthcare or first aid managed at Sonlight such as bee sting, scrapes and bumps, minor headache or sore throat.
